



RTD provides options for this weekend's events

Some detours are in place to accommodate activities

DENVER (Jan. 15, 2020) - The [Regional Transportation District](#) (RTD) provides a wide variety of rail and bus service to the downtown area for this weekend's activities. Due to temporary detours, passengers should plan ahead and expect minor delays.

THE WOMEN'S MARCH

The March will begin at 9 a.m., Saturday, Jan. 18, at Civic Center Park and last approximately four hours. It will exit Civic Center Park south on Bannock Street, turn left onto 13th Avenue, turn left onto Lincoln Street, turn right onto 14th Street, turn left onto Grant Street, turn left onto Colfax Avenue and return to Civic Center Park at Cleveland Place.

The following bus routes will experience detours for approximately three hours related to the Women's March:

- 0, 6, 9, 10, 15, 15L, 16, 48, 52, 83L

THE MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. DAY MARADE

Riders are encouraged to take bus or rail downtown for the Martin Luther King, Jr. Day Marade on Monday, Jan. 20. However, during the Marade, there will be some detours. The Marade will begin at 10:30 a.m. at City Park, at the statue of Martin Luther King, Jr. It will exit City Park on Esplanade Street, turn right onto Colfax Avenue and then proceed west to Broadway Boulevard. The parade will then enter Civic Center Park for the final ceremony.

Starting at approximately 10:30 a.m. and lasting approximately three hours, the following bus routes will experience Marade-related detours:

- 0, 6, 9, 10, 12, 15, 15L, 16, 16L, 20, 24, 52, 83L

RTD's administrative offices will be closed on Martin Luther King, Jr. Day in observance of this holiday. RTD sales outlets will be open regular hours, from 7 a.m. to 6:30 p.m.

Riders should expect Parade-related detours to add a few extra minutes of travel time to their trips, and should check scheduled departure times when planning their trips.
