

Weekend snowstorm in the metro area may impact RTD service

DENVER (March 13, 2021) – As snowy conditions continue, the Regional Transportation District (RTD) is expecting delays and slower travel times through the weekend as train and bus operators cautiously navigate icy and snow-packed conditions. Bus schedules can be impacted by wet and icy roads as well as traffic delays. Trains are often delayed due to low visibility and the need for slower speeds around stations and through crossings. RTD will continue to evaluate the situation to prepare for the Monday morning commute.
