LOCAL 10-RIDE TICKETS

Local, Local Discount, Local Youth, and Local LiVE tickets allow you to ride in up to two rail fare zones; on Local, Limited, and FlexRide bus service; and take Local trips on Regional and SkyRide bus service. You can transfer in any direction for three hours.

Upgrade required for Regional and Airport trips. No upgrades to day passes.

REGIONAL 10-RIDE TICKETS

Regional, Regional Discount, Regional Youth, and Regional LiVE tickets allow you to travel in up to three rail fare zones; on Local, Limited, Regional, and FlexRide bus service; and take Regional trips on SkyRide bus service. You can transfer in any direction for three hours.

Upgrade required for Airport trips. No upgrades to day passes.

Discount, Youth, and LiVE tickets

Discount tickets are valid for seniors 65+, individuals with disabilities, and Medicare recipients. Proof of eligibility is required.

Youth tickets are valid for youth ages 6-19. Proof of eligibility is required.

LiVE tickets are valid for individuals enrolled in RTD's Live Program. A LiVE Discount Identification Card is required as proof of eligibility.

HOW TO USE 10-RIDE TICKETS

On buses

Place ticket in fare box. If you want to continue your trip on another bus or train, you must request a 3-hour pass. The pass will show the expiration date and time, and must be clearly presented to the operator on every boarding.

If transferring from bus to train, present the bus-issued 3-hour pass to the fare inspector on request.

On trains

If travel begins on a train, passengers must validate (date-stamp) the ticket at the train station by inserting it into a ticket validator. The ticket can only be validated once and expires 3 hours after it is validated. Present the validated ticket to the fare inspector on request. Failure to present a validated ticket will be considered fare evasion and will be enforced according to RTD policy and Colorado State Law.

If transferring from train to bus, hand the validated ticket to the bus operator when boarding.

10-Ride tickets are non-refundable. Expired tickets may be used or exchanged by Jan 31st. Validated tickets and bus-issued 3-hour passes are non-transferable.

One ticket per fare-paying passenger.
One fare-paying passenger per ticket.

Reproduction or alteration of a 10-Ride ticket with intent to defraud is a felony C.R.S. §18-5-102.
